MAYOR'S REPORT – Mayor Cicero commended Mr. Glady for keeping streets clean and maintaining salt levels. Mayor Cicero stated that he has been in contact with C.E.I. regarding the aging infrastructure and reliability of services. Mayor Cicero said he will not stop conversations with C.E.I. until there is a resolve for our City.

FINANCE COMMITTEE – Chairman Ward stated he met with Mayor Cicero, Finance Director Kovalchik and each department head to review their 2013 experience and 2014 budget requests. Mr. Ward delivered a brief summary of last year's expenses and the City's approximate appropriations for this year. Mr. Ward aired the Finance Committee will be meeting February 24, 2014 at 6:00PM to discuss 2014 appropriations and other financial issues.

<u>PUBLIC LANDS AND BUILDINGS COMMITTEE</u> – Chairman Schlessel was not present; therefore, he had no report.

**ROADS AND UTILITIES COMMITTEE** – Chairman Packard had no formal report; however, he gave kudos to the Service Department for their great job on keeping the roads clean.

**SERVICE AND SEWERS COMMITTEE** – Chairman Gambatese had no report.

**SAFETY COMMITTEE** – Chairman LoPresti had no report.

**LEGISLATIVE COMMITTEE** – Chairman Ward had no report.

**PLANNING COMMISSION** – Chairman Frey had no report.

SOUTH EUCLID-LYNDHURST BOARD OF EDUCATION – Cassandra Jones congratulated the Brush Hockey Team; they qualified for the Baron's Cup III for the first time ever in Arcs Hockey history. The team is the third seed behind West Geauga and Parma.

Ms. Jones announced the South Euclid Lyndhurst Schools launched its very own You Tube Channel, SEL On Demand as a means to keep the community engaged in special events throughout the district.

Ms. Jones said the district is waiting to hear decisions regarding calamity days; however, the district has three (3) floating days it can use as make up days if necessary.

Ms. Jones reported the South Euclid Lyndhurst Schools value their senior citizen community and encourages active participation in many ways, including the Brown and Gold Card. The SEL Brown and Gold Card permits free access to SEL district events for senior citizens in the community. Ms. Jones said a letter from Superintendent Linda Reid, a calendar of notable events and a Brown and Gold Card were mailed to all senior citizens to promote this program.

Mr. Frey said attendance at district functions has been less than stellar, and asked if the district has any thoughts on collectively working together to get better attendance.

Ms. Jones explained the district hopes the new You Tube Channel, newsletters and providing profile sheets for each school will help motivate residents to become more involved.

Mr. Gambatese told Ms. Jones he appreciates notification of school closings the night before.

Mayor Cicero stated Ms. Reid is in constant contact with the police department and service department when weather is bad to aid in the decision of closing schools.

Richard Clark, 5347 Chickadee, thanked Ms. Jones for the Brown and Gold Card and Mr. Glady for the clean streets. Mr. Clark inquired the status of the moratorium on parking commercial vehicles in personal driveways.
