Scott Kravitz, 5148 Oakmont, stated he and his fiancé just purchased a home in Lyndhurst this past weekend and wanted to introduce himself.

Mr. Kravitz said his goal is to be the July recipient of the Property of Distinction Award.

Jill Walker, 5167 Haverford, read the following into the record:

I respectfully request that this statement be included in the minutes of tonight's Council. Thank you. Mayor Ward, You have been in discussions with the Humane Society of the United States and according to the Sun Newspaper article of May 26th, are considering a non-lethal approach to control the deer population in Lyndhurst.

Based on that, it is not unreasonable to assume you may have changed your position on resuming trap and bolt. I hope that your investigation into non-lethal alternatives is based on a sincere desire to make changes. Therefore, I respectfully ask you to declare a moratorium on trap and bolt and inform the public that you will not renew the contract with A&S Animal Control for resumption of this barbaric practice.

In light of the seriousness of this decision, I realize you may need time to assess your commitment before responding. For that reason, I respectfully request that you reply at the next meeting of Council whether or not you will declare a moratorium, which would be in everyone's best interest, putting you at the helm of real progress. Thank you.

Dennis Gustavson, 4907 Westbourne, stated this will be his last Council Meeting, after 41 years he and his wife will be moving to Broadview Heights.

Mr. Gustavson said Lyndhurst is a great community, has wonderful services and he has no complaints.

Elyzabeth DeGiovanni, 5169 Thornbury, asked the Mayor to not put a moratorium on trap and bolt, something needs to be done with the deer.

E. Dale Inkley, 5126 E. Farnhurst, commends Mayor Ward for listening to all sides regarding deer.

Mr. Inkley spoke to Mr. Allen from the Village of Walton Hills regarding their experience with trap and bolt. Mr. Allen said the event occurred in the early nineties, Mr. Inkley said that a 25 year old event should not be compared to the techniques used today. Mr. Inkley stated Lyndhurst would not treat deer that way. Mr. Inkley said Ms. Walker is misrepresenting the way Lyndhurst is handling the deer. Mr. Inkley said Lyndhurst needs a solution and a moratorium would not be a good idea.

Mayor Ward stated he would not declare a moratorium on anything, he refuses to limit the City's options.

Vice Mayor Schlessel announced Councilman Aaron Mendelsohn has submitted his resignation, Mr. Mendelsohn has taken a job in Florida, effective July 1, 2016.
