

Effective January 1, 2013, all new One, Two, and Three Family Dwelling Houses, shall comply with Chapter 11, Energy Efficiency, of the 2013 Residential code of Ohio.

In fulfilling the requirements of Chapter 11, you have three choices in which to demonstrate compliance.

- A. The “International Energy Conservation Code”
- B. Sections 1101 through 1104 of Chapter 11.
- C. Section 1105 – “The Ohio Home Builder’s Association (OHBA) Alternative Energy Code Option.”

When submitting plans under this section, the method you are using to meet the Energy Efficiency Requirements as stated herein, shall be plainly indicated on the top (cover) sheet of the proposed plans along with the supporting documentation.

In addition, indicate the “R Value” of the insulation used on the Sectional Drawing of the proposed plans.

Plans not meeting the requirements herein shall not be reviewed.

*Note: A minimum of 50 percent of the lamps in permanently installed lighting fixtures shall be high-efficacy lamps.*
