

**RESOLUTION NO. 2014-33
INTRODUCED BY: ADMINISTRATION**

**A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE MAYOR TO EXECUTE A
PLAN OF OPERATION WITH THE STATE OF OHIO REGARDING
THE TRANSFER OF EXCESS DEPARTMENT OF DEFENSE
PERSONAL PROPERTY, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.**

WHEREAS, The United States Department of Defense currently has in its possession personal property which it may transfer to local law enforcement agencies upon request in accordance with Federal Law; and

WHEREAS, the Lyndhurst Police Department is such a local law enforcement agency; and

WHEREAS, in order to promote the efficient and expeditious transfer of the property, and to ensure accountability of the property, it is necessary to enter into a Plan of Operation with the State of Ohio. Now therefore,

**BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE CITY OF LYNDHURST,
CUYAHOGA COUNTY, STATE OF OHIO, THAT:**

SECTION 1. The Mayor of the City of Lyndhurst is hereby authorized to execute a Plan of Operation with the State of Ohio regarding the transfer of excess Department of Defense personal property to the City.

SECTION 2. The Plan of Operation shall be as generally set out in the document attached hereto and made a part hereof as Exhibit A.

SECTION 3. The Chief of Police is hereby authorized to submit an application for participation to the State of Ohio Coordinator for approval, as is required in the Plan of Operation, and to do all other things necessary to comply with the requirements of said Plan of Operation.

SECTION 4. Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution have been taken at open meetings of this Council; and that deliberations of this Council and of its committees, resulting in such formal action, took place in meetings open to the public, in compliance with all statutory requirements including the requirements of Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

SECTION 5. This Resolution shall hereby be declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the health, safety and welfare of the residents of the City of Lyndhurst in order that the City may be eligible for such personal property as soon as possible. It shall therefore take effect immediately upon the affirmative vote of not less than five members elected to Council and approval by the Mayor or otherwise at the earliest time allowed by law.
